The Emergence of Protocuneiform Writing: From administrative officers to pioneers of literacy

Abstract

In Southern Mesopotamia, writing emerged at the end of the 4th millennium BCE as a sophisticated communicative system responding to the needs of the growing urbanization. The creators of the protocuneiform system were "simple" administrators, who created a tool capable of generating outstanding developments far beyond their initial intentions. Soon, writing transcended the field of accounting as its tools, the lexical texts, inaugurated a new path, fostering the social identity of an emerging cultural elite.
